Sunday, 31 March 2013

Easter remembers – and re-members. In today's passages, remembering recalls words told by Jesus and news preached by Peter. Re-remembering reconstitutes relationships sealed off by stones. Isaiah evokes memories that are not captive to what has been, but open to what God can do. Easter plants cornerstones of hope and harvests first fruits of life. The women remember and tell. Why do we keep telling this story over and over, year after year? We do it to remember not old details but new insights and fresh perspectives; so that we can remember what a challenge it still is to look death in the face and trust "Jesus is risen."
