PROFILE—JUDY & KEITH GRIMM

Judy was born in Bordertown SA and was a member of the Methodist Church from birth. She remembers sitting and pumping the organ for her mother before taking up playing the organ for the Sunday School at age 11 and then for the church from 15 years. She worked in her father's motor dealership until she married Keith in 1955. They have three children—Peter (who died at age 14), Jill and Margot, and four grandchildren in Holland (one at University in Scotland). Judy was committed to the church and filled many positions—Sunday School teacher, Elder, Quarterly Meeting member, Manse Trust, Parish Councillor, Women's Fellowship office bearer. She always considered that it was important to be involved in whatever was happening in the town whether the children were involved or not. She is still cooking for people and events and visiting people as well as playing the organ for us each week and working in the Op Shop.

Keith was born in Naracoorte in 1928 where his father was manager of the butter factory. He went to high school in Horsham for only two years as he needed to help the family by earning a living. His first job was in the bank in Stawell for 36/- per week (\$3.60). After six months he was moved to Mildura which was a big jolt to a 16 year old. After two years he returned home and joined Goldsborough Mort in Penola, then Naracoorte and Bordertown, where he met Judy. He became a manager and then partner in a general farm agency that became a Datsun dealer in the very early days of Japanese cars in Australia. He was the principal agent for 23 years. Keith has served in various positions in the church starting as Secretary of the Kalangadoo Presbyterian Church when he was only 18. He also served in many other organisations over the years usually ending up as the Secretary or Treasurer. In 1969 Keith joined Rotary as the charter Secretary for Bordertown starting a love of service through that organisation. For 9 years he served on the District Youth Exchange Committee looking after exchange visits with Japan. Over the years Keith and Judy hosted 13 students themselves and they have enjoyed the opportunity to visit them later or have them return as adults. Keith was appointed District Governor for 1990 –91 covering 54 clubs over western Victoria and south-east South Australia. During this time they travelled 39,000 kilometres and met hundreds of people that they regard as friends. It was during this time that they found Clifton Springs as well as meeting up again with Jonnie and John Mander (whose daughter had also been an exchange student to Japan). They moved to Clifton Springs 22 years ago and have been part of our church ever since.

Judy and Keith attend church because they always have, they love the Lord, and life wouldn't be complete without the church. We are grateful for their involvement.
