JustAct – another success from people action – and more action

Uzbekistan is a land-locked nation in central Asia, to the north of Afghanistan. Every year, millions of people in this country, including children, are forced by the government to pick cotton. Failing to take part in this can mean fines, imprisonment and even statesponsored torture. Eventually this cotton will end up in fabrics and then in garment factories, and ultimately, it can end up in your favourite t-shirt.

Pressure from decent people has secured commitments from over 170 companies to ban use of cotton from Uzbekistan in their products. These companies include wellknown brands such as Adidas. Levi Strauss. The Walt Disney Company, Target, Cotton On, Myer and Kmart. It has taken more pressure to wring a similar pledge from Super Retail Group (owner of brands such as Rebel and Ray's Outdoors). The strength of these commitments is uncertain. JustAct has an on-line petition calling on cotton-using companies to ensure that they do not use cotton from Uzbekistan. More people signing this petition will reinforce the need for garment companies to honour their promises if they want the business of decent people. The petition can be found on the website @

Ascension Day begins a period of waiting for the followers of Jesus.
