Is Messy Church 'church'?

When you come to Messy Church do you think you are coming to church or to a craft club? This is an important question that forms the basis of what Messy Church is about.

Messy Church was started in England as a way of providing a church opportunity for people who didn't want to come to:

- ♦ church on a Sunday morning,
- ♦ a service that they had trouble understanding,
- a building where they were afraid of how things happened.

Craft was seen as a method that allowed people to interact and talk about Jesus and God without it being a heavy religious thing. But there was to be service that celebrated Jesus being there for us; a time to bring the craft theme together to a Bible experience.

Messy Church may not involve lots of hymns, readings, prayers and stories but it needs to have some of those things as the method of learning about Jesus. The discussion questions and handout provide an opportunity to consider some of the religious aspect of what we are doing and why. It is important for us to thing about the questions.

Messy Church also includes a meal which is seen as sharing the hospitality of Jesus—something Jesus told us was important for us to do regularly.
