
# Messy Church @ Home




### 1. What is Mother's Day?

The modern holiday of Mother's Day was first celebrated in 1908, when Anna Jarvis held a memorial for her mother at St Andrew's Methodist Church in Grafton, West Virginia. St Andrew's Methodist Church now holds the International Mother's Day Shrine. Her campaign to make Mother's Day a recognized holiday in the United States began in 1905, the year her mother, Ann Reeves Jarvis, died. Ann Jarvis had been a peace activist who cared for wounded soldiers on both sides of the American Civil War, and created Mother's Day Work Clubs to address public health issues. Anna Jarvis wanted to honour her mother by continuing the work she started and to set aside a day to honour all mothers because she believed a mother is "the person who has done more for you than anyone in the world". In 1914, President Woodrow Wilson signed a proclamation designating Mother's Day, held on the second Sunday in May, as a national holiday to honour mothers.







**Text:** Proverbs 1: 8—Listen, my son, to your father's instruction and do not forsake your mother's teaching.

**Question:** Why don't want we to listen to our mother or father's instructions sometimes?

**Answers:** We think we know better. We just want to ignore them. Sometimes we think is too hard to do want they ask. But God does tell us to obey our parents.

### 3. Mother's Day Card

**Need** for card shown: Pink cardboard, white paper, green paper, red (or any colour) paper, pencil, scissors, glue, textas.

Instructions: Draw a heart shape on cardboard and cut out. Draw a smaller heart shape on white paper and cut out. Draw tulip stem and leaves on green paper and cut out. Draw four tulip petals in red paper and cut out. Fold cardboard and white heart in half. Glue whiteheart to cardboard on centre line. Glue stem and leaves on centre line. Fold tulip petals in half, glue together and to card . Fold card in half and write something on the front.

**Text:** Luke 1: 46-48—And Mary said: "My soul glorifies the Lord ... all generations will call me blessed"

Question: How can you show your mother that she is special?

**Answers:** Making, or giving her a card. Making her feel special by words that you say or things that you do for her.



Need: Cardboard, photos, scissors, glue, textas.

**Instructions:** Get some photographs of your mum (that you are allowed to have). Cut photos into different shapes or leave as is. Glue onto cardboard. Decorate cardboard with textas.

**Text:** John 19: 27— Jesus said to the disciple, "Here is your mother." From that time on, this disciple took her into his home.

**Question:** Why do you think Jesus said this whilst he was on cross?

**Answers:** He wanted the disciple, thought to be John, to look after his mother. Women left without a husband or son struggled to survive at that time. He was indicating his love for his mother.







### 5. Bath bomb

### **Ingredients:**

Heart -shaped (or any) mould or small patty papers

1/4 cup citric acid

1/2 cup baking soda

1/4 cup sea salt or Epsom salt

2 tablespoons corn starch/flour

1 tablespoons olive oil

Pink food dye optional if you want to have a coloured bath bomb

5 drops therapeutic grade lavender / essential oils optional

### Instructions:

In a large bowl, combine the citric acid, baking soda, sea salt and corn starch and then mix well.

In a separate bowl, add the oil and then a couple drops of pink (or other colour) food colouring and three-five drops of essential oil and mix well.

Slowly add the wet mix into the dry ingredients and mix—it should be like damp sand. Add a teaspoon of water if needed.

Fill mixture into your mould and press down firmly.


Leave to dry overnight.

Text: Proverbs 23: 25

Question: What things make your mother happy?

**Answers:** When you show you love her and know that she loves you. When you do things to help her. When she has some time on

her own—like having a bath.

**Need:** 10 objects on a tray (perhaps the items from the scavenger hunt) and observe them for a couple of minutes.


A. Cover them and see if you can write them all down from memory.

**Question:** How do you honour your parents?
