PROFILE—GRAHAM CLUTTERBUCK

Graham is one of the newer members of the congregation joining W@9 in February 2019 following he and wife Julie's retirement from farming at Mount Beauty due to ill health. Graham was born in Albury. He attended primary school at the Kiewa Valley Consolidated School, where his parents had a farm, followed by secondary schooling at Mt Beauty High School. Leaving school he joined the Public Service as a clerical officer in the Department of Air. Not quite his thing he then took on child care with the Salvation Army and also spent some time with the Sisters of Mercy at North Geelong. Next he became a Welfare Officer with the Department of Social Welfare, that changed its name many times to what is now the Department of Human Services. By chance one day he noticed the National Parks Service and became a Ranger working mostly at Cape Schanck and Lysterfield National



Parks. From a farm background to a ranger was ideal and stirred his interest in wildlife. He started his own wildlife education business and toured schools in Melbourne and Geelong talking about wildlife and how they can be protected. The YMCA eventually bought out his business and he returned to the Kiewa Valley to help out on the family farm with his brother.

Graham is married to Julie and they have three sons, and a daughter who lives in Geelong. They have one grand daughter who is an active eighteen month old.

Graham's early life on the farm did not allow for a lot of activity but farm life was good for creating your own activity. Of course he played local football and attended church. As a young man he was involved with the Young Farmers Club. When he was with the Narre Warren Uniting Church he ran the Youth Club where his children attended. At Mt Beauty UC Graham became a member of the Church Council and was

responsible for the Mission and Outreach activities of the church. It was through this that he promoted support for African projects. One project was Knickers for Nairobi that received amazing support across a broad area to provide girls in Nairobi with knickers to wear during their periods which enabled them to still go to school. It was when Graham and Julie were in Africa that some nuns showed them about some stoves that would greatly assist women and families with cooking. Mt Beauty took this on and this is now our loose change project.

Why does Graham come to church? Because he enjoys the fellowship and worship, especially when it is related to everyday life, and the opportunity to work with others in outreach work.
