PROFILE—MARGARET FREEMANTLE OAM

Margaret was born in Naracoorte, SA where her father farmed. She had one only sister. The family then moved to Mooralla near Hamilton in Victoria and she attended the local state school—riding a horse to school. As an 11 year old it was off to boarding school at Presbyterian Girls College, Adelaide for 6 years; she became the head of boarders. During a gap year she travelled around Central Australia experiencing the wonders of our country. Margaret was raised as her father's "son" and learnt to drive on the farm at age 11 and to be able to do all the



farm tasks. In 1958 she got to fulfil her lifelong dream of commencing nursing training at the Alfred Hospital in Melbourne. It was during this time that she nursed a very badly injured man from a car accident who was not expected to live—this was Tony.

As a twenty-first birthday present Margaret went off to England in 1962 to work in hospitals and set up a flat with other nurses from the Alfred at Mayfair. She got to do lots of travel around and was lucky to receive some special support from the Australian Embassy there due to her father's contacts. She returned home to Hamilton in 1963 and three weeks later met Tony at a dance there—she recognised him. They were married in 1964 and had three children—James, Fiona and David and now has seven grandchildren. To fill her time at home Margaret set up a small business selling bibs and children's clothes—Pud's Bibbery. She also starting her charitable work fundraising to set up Currawong House—a temporary emergency care home for children instead of needing to send them to Melbourne. Margaret became the spokesperson for the fundraising group and is pleased that more than 2500 children were cared for here. Margaret also took on the Family Day Care coordinator role for the Hamilton Region for 20 years and became involved in counselling and welfare support. Margaret and Tony retired to Clifton Springs in November 1999 and immediately joined our church. In January 2000 she was awarded the Medal of the Order of Australia.

Margaret and Tony attended the Hamilton Presbyterian Church and then Uniting Church where Tony was in a choir and has been in our choir since arriving. Margaret's interests now are music, sewing, family, bridge and golf. She attends church because she can find peace, caring, understanding and faith.
