Discipleship at Home

One of the roles of Messy Church is to create opportunities for us to

think about Jesus
Christ, not just at
Messy Church but
everywhere. At home
we might say grace
before a meal (check
out the look on the
child's face in this
picture) but we can
also tackle something a
bit bigger by asking
some questions. Dr.
Kara Powell of Fuller



Youth Institute in a seminar about **Sticky Faith** talked about how to help our kids develop a faith that sticks beyond high school and suggests asking four questions as discussion around the meal table:

- 1. What was your HIGH today? I made the mistake of asking my granddaughter "how was school today?" to receive the answer "Good" and so I had to ask another question.
- 2. What was your LOW today? Like what made you sad?
- 3. What MISTAKE did you make today? Without being judgemental of the answer but providing a response if needed.
- 4. Where did you see JESUS today? Sometimes good for an adult to start with this.

These questions may need some explanation to start with but require everyone, not just the children, to think about their answers. Perhaps you could give them a try!

Inviting Jesus into that everyday practice takes it from ordinary to sacred, from dinner to discipleship.
