PANDEMIC

This is an extract from the Barnabas Aid magazine for July/ August from their International Director, Dr Patrick Sookhdeo:

COVID19 has had a devastating effect on the world and in particular in Third World countries. Disease is followed by economic devastation and destitution that creates anxiety and destroys hope. He says Christians need to seize the opportunity to bring God into control with VUCA:

Vision: Habakkuk 2: 2 tells us that vision is important. It gives us purpose of existence, to show what God wants and our place in it.

Understanding: We need to understand the times; 1 Chronicles 12: 32 can help. Yes, we need science but we need people of God who will make plain the vision.

Courage: We need courage not to retreat, not to see only opposition and obstacles. We can go forward with compassion and love.

Action: Action requires resolve. It means taking the initiative, breaking out of apathy, deciding what is to be done and doing it.
