

PROFILE—ELIZABETH & TOM THOMAS

Elizabeth was born in the south of India in Kerala State with three siblings. Her father was a professor of English and her mother a gynaecologist. They moved to the mountains in the north to Lucknow for their work when she was very young. Her schooling was all done at boarding school before she went to the Lucknow University where she completed a Bachelor of Arts in Psychology, a Master of Psychology and then a Bachelor of Education. Tom was arranged by the families and they met for fifteen minutes prior to the wedding weekend. They were married in 1977 in an Anglican church by a Scottish minister. Tom was raised by his grandparents in Lucknow who ran a tea plantation. They have two sons, who both work in IT jobs, and four grandchildren. They moved to Bangalore where Elizabeth was a teacher then the Department of Psychology Head.

They came to Australia in 1983, sponsored by Elizabeth's sister, and lived in Albury (where they met Rev Christine Moimoi). Tom's Bachelor of Economics and Politics were not recognised in Australia and Elizabeth's only partly. Elizabeth worked as a psychologist with the Department of Health and then the Department of Community Services, and for a time in private practice. Tom took a job as a motor mechanic, because of his interest in cars, and later became a teacher in the TAFE sector after completing further study. They retired to Clifton Springs in 2012 to be close to the children and to the sea. Elizabeth volunteers in the Op Shop once a week and enjoys line dancing, walking, and taking time to enjoy life, whilst Tom has an interest in model planes.


