PROFILE—IAN COOK

lan was born in Camberwell and spent his early life in Balwyn with two sisters and a brother; his father was a public servant with the PMG. He attended Deepdene State School—a school with about a thousand children. It was then on to Balwyn High School as part of the first intake of this new school. Next was two years at Burwood Teachers College and another two years at Dookie Agricultural College before starting his teaching career. This took him all over the state. First school was Murrayville as a Maths and Science secondary teacher, followed by Poowong Consolidated where as part of a science experiment he damage the ceiling with a rocket. He started a Young Farmers Club in Poowong to interest the students in agricultural matters.



He was active in the Methodist church at Deepdene including youth group and Christian Endeavour. It was CE that had a big influence in developing his leadership and in starting to lead some services there from age 18. He met Joan through the youth group in Poowong. Joan attended the Ranceby Union church—an early united Presbyterian and Methodist church. After marriage he was posted to the two teacher Walpeup Primary School, then Lalor, and Mallacoota P-12 School as Principal, followed by Sale and Kerang South Primary School. In all postings Ian became fully involved in the schools, community, church and youth groups. After many years of lay leading services he was appointed as a Lay Preacher and served for 40 years, sometimes preaching on five occasions on a Sunday. Ian retired as a result of a heart attack and Ian and Joan moved to Clifton Springs in 2006 because many friends were heading down this way. They now are happily living at St. Leonards. They have raised two boys and two girls and now have 12 grandchildren. Ian has enjoyed tennis, football


