PENTECOST

Pentecost, comes from the Greek meaning "50th day", and is celebrated in Christian churches on the fiftieth day of Easter.




It commemorates the descent of the Holy Spirit on the Apostles and other disciples following the Crucifixion, Resurrection, and Ascension of Jesus Christ. It also marks the beginning of the Christian church's mission to the world.

The Jewish feast of Pentecost (Shavuot) was primarily a thanksgiving for the first fruits of the wheat harvest, but it was later associated with a remembrance of the Law given by God to Moses on Mount Sinai. The church's transformation of the Jewish feast to a Christian festival was thus related to the belief that the gift of the Holy Spirit to the followers of Jesus was the first fruits of a new order that fulfilled and succeeded the old order of the Law.

The festival was first celebrated in the Christian church in at least the second century. It became a popular day for baptisms and in Anglican churches is called Whitsunday. Red is often worn to symbolize the "tongues of fire" that descended on the disciples from the Holy Spirit.


The Darkling Thrush
